



Summary of the FSSB Board Meeting – Tuesday 31 March 2026

The FSSB Board met on 31 March 2026, with eight members in attendance and one member absent with apologies

Key points of discussion included the following:

1. Conflicts of Interest

There was no change to previously declared interests,

2, Key Decisions and Matters Arising

Season Tickets

The Board approved the pricing strategy for next season.

Communications & Transparency

The Board discussed its approach to communications and agreed to align around a more consistent way of working.

This will support clearer, more joined-up messaging and help ensure communications are handled in a coordinated and considered way.

Website & Member Engagement

The Board discussed plans to enhance the Society's website and overall communication with members. The aim is to improve how information is shared, make it easier for members to engage, and better reflect the Club's identity and community activity.

This work will be developed over time, with changes introduced in stages as priorities, resources, and technical considerations allow.

Financial Position

The Board reviewed the latest financial position, and whilst still showing a loss, performance is better than expected.

Steps are in place to further improve performance, including ongoing income initiatives and upcoming matchdays.

The Board remains focused on maintaining a stable and sustainable financial position.

Financial Controls & Governance

The Board noted ongoing improvements with work underway to enhance financial dashboards, strengthen budget tracking, and provide clearer governance.

Member Engagement

A Members Forum is planned for mid to late July (before the season starts). It will be held as a hybrid event, with both in-person and online attendance options available.”

Cost Saving & Infrastructure Projects

The solar installation went live on 1 April 26, with estimated annual savings of £7k in the first 12 months.

Facilities Investment

The Club is applying for a Football Foundation grant to improve facilities for women and girls, including changing rooms, toilets and showers. The Club will contribute around 25% towards the project, which has strong support from the Board.
